Process	 The BPDA makes their <u>Buying Plan</u> available online quarterly. It gives a 24-month schedule of tentative upcoming procurement opportunities. Over the next 24 months (about 2 years), the BPDA expects to spend roughly \$89.8 Million. All contracts that are currently open for bidding can be found on the BPDA's <u>Procurement Portal</u>.
Best Practices	 You can access any existing and past proposals on their website through the Procurement Portal. For businesses looking to work with the BPDA, it is recommended to look over older proposals on this site as a sort of "study guide" to get a sense of how the projects have evolved over time. When biding on contracts, be sure to review the documents in their entirety Pay special attention to the "Form for Bidders Qualifications"; this takes the most time to fill out Collect and prepare required documents well in advance to alleviate stress and submittal time. Participate in Q&A period and/or any bidders conferences or site tours Submit responses before the deadline to avoid disqualification
